
THE NEW FERRY REGENERATION PROJECT

WHERE IT ALL BEGAN

In March 2022, Wirral Council appointed The Regenda Group as its development partner for the New Ferry regeneration project.

The multi-site project aims to rebuild the area following a 2017 gas explosion, delivering more than 70 new homes across two phases.

The first phase of the project is now complete, and residents are living in the first new homes in the heart of New Ferry.

Together, we're not just building homes – we're creating opportunities for local people, supporting local businesses, and shaping a brighter future for New Ferry.

THE HOMES WE'VE MADE

The completed Phase 1 homes are split across two sites at the entrance to New Ferry's high street. Phase 1 includes 34 one and two bedroom apartments. They are at two sites on Bebington Road (Site B) and Boundary Road (Site C).



BOUNDARY ROAD

Boundary Road offers 20 Rent to Buy apartments through Redwing. The Rent to Buy tenure enables residents to rent affordably (20% reduction on market rent) while helping them to save for a mortgage deposit.

BEBINGTON ROAD

Designed to echo the Victorian and Edwardian heritage of the high street, with extended fronts reminiscent of historic shopfronts that stood previously, Bebington Road offers 14 Affordable Rent apartments through Regenda Homes.




SOCIAL VALUE IN MOTION




WELCOME HOME

All 1- and 2-bedroom homes have been described by residents as “not just grey apartments” but homes full of character.

As one new family put it:

BEYOND BUILDINGS

Regeneration is about more than bricks and mortar. Since we started on site in March 2024, the project has generated **£1,480,792*** in social value.

WHAT IS SOCIAL VALUE?

Social value is a measurement of the benefits of the work we do for people and communities. It quantifies how different interventions affect people's lives, their wellbeing, or their quality of life.

HOW DO WE CALCULATE SOCIAL VALUE?

The Social Value in this report has been calculated using the HACT metric system*. HACT partners with organisations across the housing sector to drive value for residents and communities through insight-led products and services encouraging innovation and fostering collaboration.

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PLACED ACADEMY


We funded a flagship programme to empower young people from Liverpool and Wirral to develop skills, explore careers in the built environment, and influence live regeneration projects through site visits to New Ferry and creative workshops on design, public spaces and the development process.

It's all about making sure communities benefit from the opportunities created by major development!

SUPPORT THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

Our Construction Director, Alastair Mail, visited St John Plessington College to deliver careers advice to 60 young people. The team arranged work experience on the New Ferry site with our electrical sub-contractors for a student who was interested in becoming an electrician.

Managing Director, Gill Kelly, spoke to 40 young girls at Co-op Academy, encouraging them to consider a career in construction ahead of making their GCSE choices.



STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES

M&Y Maintenance and Construction donated £1,820 to Rakers Junior Football Club, funding weekly pitch hire for Friday Night Football for an entire year.

The Club offers local young people a safe place to play, socialise, and learn new skills. Its sessions have reduced ASB in the area, strengthened community cohesion, and built positive

relationships with local authorities – earning the club an honourable mention award from Merseyside Police.

Our Contractor, APH Plastering donated £500 to The Belvidere Centre – the only weekly youth club for children and young adults with additional needs. The donation will be used to deliver activities to the Monday Children's Club.

CELEBRATING TOGETHER, IN STYLE!

In the summer, we welcomed new residents to the first completed homes with a street party and ice cream van. This event was attended by new residents, as well as colleagues from Regenda Homes, Wirral Borough Council, local councillors and the police community support team.

In December, we marked the completion of Phase 1 – a huge milestone for the community.

Attended by residents, partners, and the local community, it was an evening filled with festive treats, cheer and carols from Grove Street Primary School pupils.

The school has been closely involved with the regeneration project, having shared their ideas to help name the apartment types and develop a brand that reflects local heritage and identity.





WASTE

Working with Reconomy, we provide a system-based waste management process. We can report on waste quickly and easily and analyse data based on workstream (including spend, tonnage reports, landfill diversion rates and segregation statistics).

The regeneration of New Ferry continues! In early 2026, we'll begin phase two, bringing 43 new homes to the former Woodhead Street car park and New Chester Road.

The new homes will be a mix of houses and apartments available for social rent through Regenda Homes and Rent to Buy through Redwing.



"The completion of the first phase of this project is another milestone in the regeneration of New Ferry and it's fantastic to see the new high-quality, affordable homes that have already been completed and are now being lived in across multiple sites in the town.
